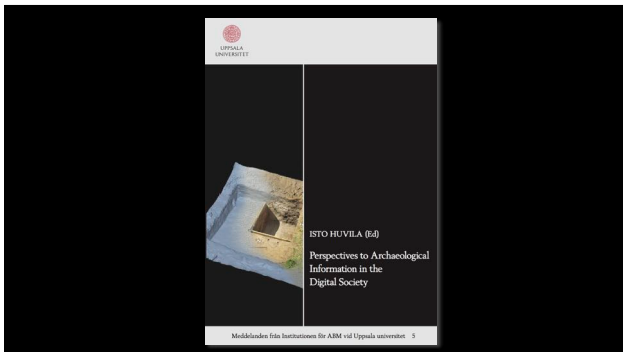

- By studying archaeological practices, knowledge production and use, social impact and industrial potential of archaeological knowledge

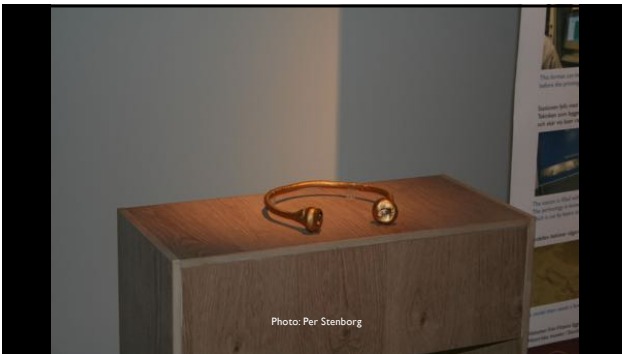
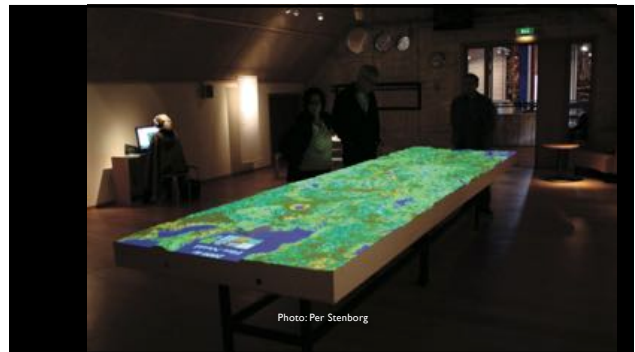
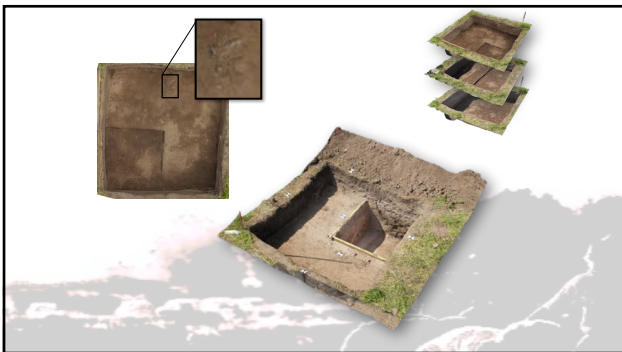
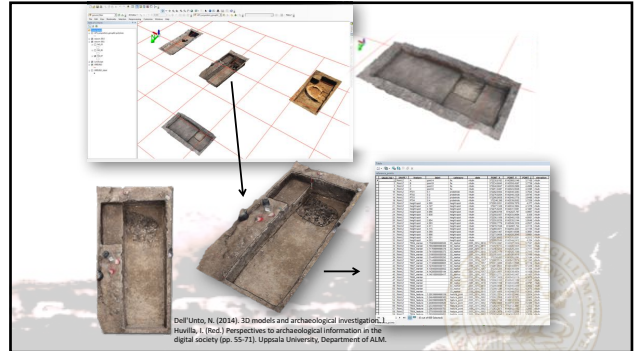
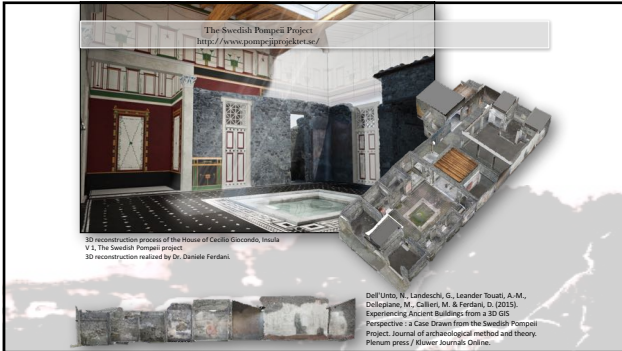


